Message from our Imam:



Asslam Alaykoom Dear Respected Parents, Students, Teachers and Staff,

Empathy is the ability to recognize, understand and share the feelings of others, like walking in someone else's shoes.

Is empathy encouraged in Islam? Absolutely! Consider this Qur'anic verse about our beloved Prophet Muhammad şallallāhu 'alayhi wa sallam (peace and blessings of Allāh be upon him):

"There has certainly come to you a Messenger from among yourselves. Grievous to him is what you suffer; [he is] concerned over you and to the believers is kind and merciful." [Qur'an: Chapter 9, Verse 128]

Our Prophet (peace and blessings of Allāh be upon him) would always feel our suffering and is praised by Allah (glorified and exalted be He) for his empathetic nature.

The Prophet (peace and blessings of Allāh be upon him) himself also encouraged us to feel empathy for each other, he was reported to have said:

"The believers in their mutual kindness, compassion and sympathy are just like one body. When one of the limbs suffers, the whole body responds to it with wakefulness and fever." [Bukhari]

This Qur'an describes believers as those who practice compassion, which is a form of empathy that moves one to help others.

"And what can make you know what is [breaking through] the difficult pass? It is the freeing of a slave, or feeding on a day of severe hunger, an orphan of near relationship, or a needy person in misery. And then being among those who believed and advised one another to patience and advised one another to compassion." [Qur'an: Chapter 90, Verses 12-17]

May Allah help us to be among those who feel about our fellow Muslims especially in Palestine and Gaza in this difficult time, Ameen.

Curriculum Update for January January

Islamic Studies

- The students will be able to recite Surat Asharh Ayahs
 1-6
- The students will also be able to recite and understand the morning Duaa
- The students will review the first 39 names of Allah SWT
- The children will learn the Pillars of Islam

Arabic

- → The students will be able to recognize letters: Alf; Sheen and Yaa
- → The students will be able to write letters: Alf; Sheen and Yaa
- → The students will be able to name words that start with the letters: Alf; Sheen and Yaa
- → The students will learn a number song in Arabic

Language Arts

- The students will understand and work with Digraphs;
 Blends and Vowel sounds.
- The students will be constructing sentences using the proper formations.
- The students will be understanding the sequence of story writing.
- The students will be prompted to ask questions as they listen to books during story time.





Social Studies:



- The students will understand ways people cooperate in order to live together peacefully.
- The students will understand how groups make decisions
- The students will develop an understanding of how people help one another at home, at school and in groups to ensure the vitality of their community
- The students will understand how caring for the natural environment contributes to the well being of our community

Science:

- The students will learn about different materials such as papers, plastics and wood used for building things.
- The students will construct simple objects and models using a variety materials
- The students will identify component parts of personally constructed objects, and describe the purpose of each part
- The students will compare two objects that have been constructed for the same purpose. identify parts in one object that correspond to parts in another, and identify similarities and differences between these parts


Math


- The students will develop measurement skills (Length: mass and capacity).
- The students will be measuring using non standard units of measurement.
- The students will use direct and indirect measurement to solve problems.
- The students will work with the number concept (1 - 100)



Key strategies







3-5 YEARS

- **DESCRIBE AND LABEL Help** children recognize their emotions and body, "You're clenching your fists. You stomped your feet. You seem angry."
- READ STORIES and discuss the character's feelings.
- Make a WE CARE CENTER.
- Coach their SOCIAL SKILLS.

5-7 YEARS

- Use PICTURES Cut out pictures from magazines or print pictures that show sad, angry, or happy faces.
- EMBRACE DIVERSITY Help children understand what they have in common with others.
- OBSERVE OTHERS Note the body language of others and guess how they might be feeling.
- Teach about HEALTHY LIMITS and their own boundaries.

9 YEARS

 Engage in highlevel DISCUSSIONS about book characters.
