UNIFORM POLICY

High School Girls:

High School girls are to wear any black abaya and a hijab (any color).

High School Boys:

Monday thru Thursday, High School boys are to wear a pair of black school pants and a green school polo shirt (short or long-sleeve). On Fridays, boys are to wear a pair of black school pants and any dress shirt with any tie or a thobe or similar form of cultural clothing. If boys wish to wear an extra Layer, a hoodie with school or legends logo is permitted.

High School Sweaters:

Only school hoodies with the school logo, or hoodies that are completely black (no writing/pictures/brand names visible) are allowed for all high school students.

FINAL EXAM SCHEDULE

ISLAM AWARDS

Islam Awards is tentatively scheduled to take place on Friday, September 27th, 2024. All marks, including final and diploma exam marks, will be included when calculating averages for awards. More information about criteria for specific awards is located at the end of this Weekly Newsletter.

DIPLOMA AND FINAL EXAM RULES

Entrance into the exam room:

- Students who are not in proper school uniform will not be permitted to enter the exam room.
- Students who arrive late will not be permitted to enter the exam room if one hour has elapsed from the starting time of the exam. Late comers will not be recompensed for the time they have lost
- Students may only enter the examination room with the consent of the supervising teacher.

Leaving the exam room:

- Students may not leave the exam room until half the time has elapsed from the start time of the exam.
- Students will not be permitted to leave the exam room without the consent of the exam supervisor.
- Students must hand in their exam prior to leaving the exam room and may not remove any portion of the exam from the exam room including scrap paper or draft/working papers.
- Once a student leaves the exam room, he/she will not be allowed back in.

Washroom use:

• Students will only be permitted to use the designated washroom. They will be escorted to the washroom by a supervisor.

Items permitted in exam rooms:

- Students shall only have tools required for writing the exam, such as: pencils, pens, erasers, exam-approved calculators, and geometry kits.
- All bags and jackets must be left at the front or back of the exam room or in lockers.
- Students may not wear hoodies or sweaters with pockets during the writing of examinations.
- Students shall not be permitted to bring any papers, notes or books that are not on the approved materials list for the exam administration.

Mobile devices and technology:

• All mobile devices or devices that can take pictures or receive text messages must be left in lockers or checked in with a teacher. Possession of any mobile device during an examination will result in a disqualification from the exam.

ISLAM AWARDS CRITERIA

The 10th Annual ISLAM Awards will be held on **Friday, September 27th, 2024 (tentative)**. To be eligible to receive an award, you must be a Junior High or High School student, and you must have **no more than one discipline report and all your grades must be above 60%.**

You must attend the ceremony to get your award.

Ouran recitation Award:

Criteria for Junior High:

This award will be given to the three most successful students from each grade.

The students must meet the following criteria to receive the award:

- Students should properly memorize the Surahs, from that grade curriculum, with the tajweed rules.
- Students should know the basic provisions of tajweed.
- Students should read with correct pronunciation of the words.

Criteria for Senior High:

This award will be given to the most successful six students from High School.

The students must meet the following criteria to receive the award:

- Students should be able to recite Surat Yassin (سورة ياسين) with the tajweed rules.
- Students should know the basic provisions of tajweed.
- Students should read with correct pronunciation of the words.

Islamic Studies Award:

This award will be given to the top three achievers from each grade in Junior High (Total 9) and the top three achievers from each grade in High School. (Total of 9)

Al Muathen, Bilal Ibn Rabah Award (Boys only):

This will be given to the top three achievers from Junior High and top three achievers from High School. (Total of 6)

Khatib/Speech Award:

This will be given to the top three achievers from Junior High and top three achievers from High School. (Total of 6)

Arabic Language:

This award will be given to the top three achievers from each grade in Junior High (Total of 9) and to one from each High School Arabic course (Total of 3).

Academic:

This award will be given to the students who achieve the following:

Criteria for Junior High:

- **Honorable Mention:** requires (74.5% 79.4%) based on an average of the 4 core subjects.
- **Honors:** requires (79.5% 89.4%) based on an average of the 4 core subjects.
- **Honors with Distinction:** requires 89.5% or higher based on an average of the 4 core subjects.

These awards will be based on the students' grades encompassing ${\bf Y1}$ results.

Criteria for High School:

- **Honorable Mention:** requires (74.5% 79.4%) based on an average of 4 core subjects.
- **Honors:** requires (79.5% 89.4%) based on an average of 4 core subjects.
- Honors with Distinction: requires 89.5% or higher based on an average of 4 core subjects.

These awards will be based on the students' grades from the 1st <u>and</u> 2nd semester results. Any course taken outside the Academy will not be considered for this Award.

Diploma & AP Stars:

- The student must achieve 80% and above on the diploma exam or four and above on the AP test.
- Any diploma course taken outside the Academy will not be considered for this Award.

<u>Top Academic:</u>

This award will be given to the top student from each grade. One from all of grade 7, one from all of grade 8, one from all of grade 9, one from grade 10, one from grade 11, and one from grade 12 (Total of 6). The

students' average will be calculated based on the four core subjects for Junior High and top four core subjects for High School.

Leadership as an Active Citizen:

This award will be given to the most successful three students from Junior High and the most successful three students from High School. (Total of 6)

Athlete of the Year Award:

This award will be given to the most successful boy and the most successful girl from Junior High (Total of 2) and the most successful boy and girl from High School (Total of 2).

EIA Profile Award:

This award will be given to a student from grade 12. The criteria for this award is found in the Student's Handbook on page 5.

Alumni Award:

The student who achieves this award must demonstrate the following:

- Giving back to the school.
- Giving back to the Muslim community.
- Giving back to the Edmonton community.
- Graduated from EIA from either Grade 9 or Grade 12.
- Volunteer minimum 50 hours.
