

CURRICULUM CORNER:

LANGUAGE ARTS:

- Students are expected to listen to and read fiction and nonfiction selections for accuracy and fluency.
- Students will develop their comprehension skills using the connection strategy (connecting to self, text, and world).
- Students will learn about parts of speech (nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs).
- Students will apply parts of speech in their writing to develop detailed sentences.
- Students will organize thoughts and ideas to form detailed written text.
- Students will be expected to write complete, detailed sentences and paragraphs using proper punctuation.
- Students are expected to read each evening to develop fluency, accuracy, and comprehension.

MATH:

- Students will learn to skip count by 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 10s, 25s, and 100s up to 1000
- Students will build their capacity to use mental math strategies.
- Students will use the commutative property to build addition and subtractions.

SOCIAL STUDIES:

- Students will explore how diverse people contribute to the identity of Alberta.
- Students will understand how Alberta is unique in Canada and worldwide.
- Students will learn that Alberta's unique identity is influenced and shaped by geography, natural resources, history, people, government, heritage, cultural diversity, sports, landscapes, and traditions.

SCIENCE:

- Students will understand that matter is anything that takes up space and has weight.
- Students will learn that matter includes solids, liquids, and gasses.
- Students will understand that melting is a change of state from solid to liquid.
- Students will understand that freezing is a change of state from liquid to solid.
- Students will learn that condensation is a change of state from gas to liquid.

Why Tardiness Matters!!

Late arrivals can prevent students from effectively setting up their academic day.

Tardiness can erode class morale and create a negative classroom environment.
