Before the conference:

- Review your child's work, grades, and progress.
- Talk with your child about his or her progress in school
- Make a list of questions to ask during the conference.
 (Remembering that this is a short time and the communication should continue throughout the year.
- Think about ways you would like to be involved in your child's learning so that you can discuss them with the teacher.

Curriculum Corner:



Islamic Studies:

- → The students will be learning and reciting with proper pronunciation Surat Al-Falaq (Ayats 1-5)
- → The students will learning the following names of Allah (SWT) العزيز Al-Aziz, المتكبر Al-Jabbar, Al- Mutakabr
- → The students will review the first 11 names of Allah SWT
- → The students will learn about our beloved prophet's wet nurse and his children
- → The students will learn the following Hadeeth من غش فلیس Men ghasha falaysa mena; He who cheats in us does not belong to us.



- **Arabic:**
- The students will learn the following letters ₹ (Haa), letter ₹ (Khaa) and ⁴ (Daal).
- The students will colour pictures beginning with the taught letters.
- The students will learn simple vocabulary words that uses the letters/sounds.



Curriculum Corner:



Language Arts:

- The students will be learning the following letters and sounds: Ff, Ii, Nn, Oo, Dd.
- The students will practicing formation of the letters: Ff, Ii, Nn, Oo, Dd.
- The students will learn initial and ending sounds of simple words.
- The students will learn to blend 2-3 sounds.
- The students will learn the following High Frequency Words: an, if, see, like, do, by, as, said, did



Math:

- → The students will explore numeral 4, 5 and 7.
- → The students will build writing skills to print the numerals with accuracy.
- → The students will learn to recognize and identify the following shapes: circle, pentagon, oval and rectangle.
- → The students will begin to create and extend patterns.





Curriculum Corner:



Social Studies:

- The students will be learning in what ways the leaders contribute to their communities.
- The students understand that there different leaders in their community eg. (parents, elders, mayors, principals and teachers)
- The students will learn that groups can set rules and expectations about how members work together.
- The students will learn on how treating group members with fairness and contribute to the well being of a community.



Science:

- → The students will examine properties of objects.
- → The students will understand that an object is anything that can be perceived using one or more of the five senses.
- → The students will understand the functions of the five senses (touch, hearing, smell, taste and feeling).







Stay involved and feel free to contact your child's teacher with any questions or concerns.

Do not talk negatively about your child's teacher or school.

Ask your children about school and encourage them to talk about their day.

Read with your child every night.

Make sure your child is getting plenty of sleep and is ready for school each day.

Help your child with his/her homework every night.

Teach your children to be responsible for their actions and their schoolwork.
