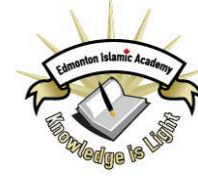

Hadith of the Month of Ramadan

Allah The Most Merciful

عَنْ أَنَسِ بْنِ مَالِكٍ رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهُمَا عَنِ النَّبِيِّ صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ قَالَ: قَالَ اللَّهُ سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى: (إِذَا تَقَرَّبَ الْعَبْدُ إِلَيَّ شِبْرًا تَقَرَّبْتُ إِلَيْهِ ذِرَاعًا، وَإِذَا تَقَرَّبَ إِلَيَّ ذِرَاعًا تَقَرَّبْتُ مِنْهُ بَاعًا، وَإِذَا أَتَانِي يَمْشِي أَتَيْتُهُ هَرْوَلَةً).

Anas Bin Malik - may Allah be pleased with both of them - narrated that the prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم narrated that Allah the Almighty, said:

"If the servant draws closer to Me by a hand-span, I shall draw closer to him by a cubit; and if he draws closer to Me by a cubit, I shall draw closer to him by the span of two outstretched arms. If he comes to Me walking, I shall come to him running."

Golden Manner of The Month

Allah the Almighty is the most merciful, most forgiving, let's go back to Allah and repent to him and strive for Allah's forgiveness especially in the holy month of Ramadan

Set Clear Intentions

Reflect on your intentions for Ramadan. Ensure that your primary focus is to draw closer to Allah, seek forgiveness, and improve your character. Mentally prepare for the spiritual aspect of fasting. Reflect on the purpose of Ramadan, and set positive intentions for the month. This can help you stay focused and motivated during the fasting period.

Eat Sahur

Have a quick meal that is nutritious and light to help you stay active all day. Also, remember to drink a lot of water.

It was narrated that Abu Hurairah (RA) said: “The Messenger of Allah (SAW) said: **“Eat Sahur, for in Sahur there are blessings.”**

Thikr and Dua

Turn to" Allah throughout the day, every day. Make du'a: remember His blessings, repent and ask forgiveness for your shortcomings, seek guidance for decisions in your life, ask for mercy for your loved ones, and more. Du'a can be done in your own language, in your own words, or you can turn to samples from the Quran and Sunnah.

Use this beautiful month to your advantage! After prayers, right before iftar, after sahur, or simply as you go about your day, make lots of thikr and dua.

Read the Quran

We're always supposed to read from the Quran, but during the month of Ramadan, we should read much more than usual. It should be the focus of our worship and effort, with time for both reading and reflection. The Quran is divided into sections to make it easier to pace yourself and accomplish completing the entire Quran before the end of the month. If you can read more than that, though, good for you!

Understand the Tafseer

Understand the Qur'an's translation. It is crucial that you read at least a little portion of the Qur'an every day since the goal of reading it is to understand Allah's words.

Pray Sunnah Prayers

The rewards of voluntary prayers in Ramadan are incredible. Rasulullah ﷺ said:

مَنْ قَامَ رَمَضَانَ إِيمَانًا وَاحْتِسَابًا غُفِرَ لَهُ مَا تَقَدَّمَ مِنْ ذَنْبِهِ

Meaning: “Whoever stands (in the voluntary night prayer of) Ramadan out of faith and in the hope of reward, his previous sins will be forgiven.” Sunnah prayers include those accompanying Fard salah, tahajjud, and salat Ad-Duha as well. Now is the perfect time to begin praying the sunnah prayers if you haven’t already.

Pray Taraweeh at the Mosque

This is the only month that we get to perform Taraweeh. You can do it at home, and even better if you can visit the mosque to do Taraweeh with your friends and family.

Sadaqah

Allah’s Messenger ﷺ was more generous in Ramadan than in any other month. Abdullah Ibn Abbas (R) said:

“The Messenger of Allah ﷺ was the most generous of all people, and he was the most generous during the month of Ramadan when Jibril would meet him.....the Prophet ﷺ would be more generous than strong winds (which cause rain and prosperity).”

[Sahih-al-Bukhari: 3220]

Sadaqah is not limited to giving out money only. You can give food to your neighbours, or feed stray animals. Anything that you give sincerely is sadaqah. Remember, the more you give, the more you will get back. InshaAllah.

Seek Forgiveness:

Take the time to sincerely seek forgiveness for any shortcomings or sins. Repentance is a crucial aspect of spiritual preparation for Ramadan.

Reflect on and Improve Yourself

This is the time to reflect on yourself as a person and to identify areas in need of change. We all make mistakes and develop bad habits. Do you tend to speak a lot about other people? Tell white lies when it is just as easy to speak the truth? Turn your eyes when you should lower your gaze? Become angry quickly? Regularly sleep through Fajr prayer?

Be honest with yourself, and strive to make just one change during this month. Don't overwhelm yourself with trying to change everything at once, as it will be much harder to maintain. **The Prophet Muhammad advised us that small improvements, done consistently, are better than large but unsuccessful attempts. So start with one change, then move on from there.**

Educate Yourself:

Attend Islamic lectures, or study circles to increase your knowledge of Islam. Understanding the teachings and principles of Islam can deepen your connection with Allah.

Remember that preparing for Ramadan is not just about increasing rituals, but also about developing a deeper connection with Allah and improving your character. Be sincere in your efforts, and may your preparations lead to a spiritually fulfilling Ramadan.

Give Up Bad Habits

Ramadan is the most effective time to quit bad habits such as smoking, backbiting, cursing, phone & computer addiction, lying, laziness, wasting time, etc. If you want your fast to be accepted by Allah, you must give up these habits.

The Messenger of Allah ﷺ said:

الصِّيَامُ جُنَّةٌ مَا لَمْ يَخْرِقْهَا (بِكَذِبٍ أَوْ غَيْبَةٍ)

Meaning: “Fasting is a shield, as long as you do not damage it (by telling lies or backbiting)”.
[Sunan an Nasa’i: 2235]

So, giving up these bad habits will elevate your Ramadan.

Avoid Wasting Time on Frivolities

During the month of Ramadan, try to restrict your schedule to allow more time for worship, reading the Quran, and fulfilling more of the other items on the above "to-do list." Ramadan only comes once a year, and we never know when our last one will be.
